Dear Cathy:

This letter is a formal request from the Franklin Historical Society to the Birmingham Area Cable Board to continue funding the purchase of a one year internet subscription from Comcast for the Franklin Historical Museum at 26165 Thirteen Mile Road in Franklin. The Board previously approved a grant for these costs incurred during the 2015-16 fiscal year. This request is for the 2016-17 fiscal year. On-site internet access is invaluable in allowing museum personnel to actually work at the museum rather than carry documents and files to locations with internet service. One of the major current projects that internet service has facilitated is scanning many archival documents that will be accessible to the public. We want to continue this effort.

The internet service will cost \$84.90 per month or \$1,018.80 annually.

POLICY ON Franchise fees:

In any given year, our policy is to Administratively Grant back to the communities any year end audit "excess" between operating (franchise) income and expense, after preserving "working capital" for operations at 25% of last year's franchise fees.

POLICY ON PEG fees:

The Board should carry a PEG Fund Balance equal to 1.2 times accumulated net depreciation of our capital assets, PLUS an amount equal to one half of a 3 year running average of PEG grants PLUS 3 months of BCTV and programing expenses)

I think we could justify going to .75 times "accumulated net depreciation" – the reality seems to be (this came up in our camera replacement discussion at PEG Cmtte) that a lot of "stuff" is cheaper now than when we first acquired it.

By the numbers, from the 2015 audit (I don't seem to have current audit – I think it was distributed at the November meeting that I missed) we had accumulated depreciation of \$749,057 (Note 4, page 14) 1.2 times = \$898,868. .75 x would be \$561,792 – a reduction of \$337,075 in that piece of the PEG reserve formula.
