AUDIT PRESENTATION FOR FISCAL YEAR 2023-2024 BY PLANTE AND MORAN

Spencer Tawa, CPA, Senior Manager, Plante and Moran presented the 2023-2024 audited report for the year ended June 30, 2024. He had slides of different Financial Statements which he explained: General Fund Balance Sheet/Statement of Net Position, Statement of Changes in Fiduciary Net Position (Income Statement). He pointed out and explained specific totals. The next pages of his report included Revenue Trend for Franchise and Peg Fees and Expenditure Trend for Board Expenditures and PEG Operations which he detailed. The last slide was "Communication with Those Charged with Governance" followed by a recommendation that a Credit Card Policy be written.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Cable Action Committee

Abraham stated there had not been a meeting as there was nothing to discuss. There was no need for a meeting today after this Board meeting. He questioned how the Board would develop a credit card policy. White will consult with the Auditor.

PEG Committee

Kamoo stated there had not been a PEG Committee meeting after the last Board meeting. There will be a meeting immediately after this meeting.

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

White reported that there were two (2) complaints; both dealt with wires which the providers needed to address. Both complaints have been addressed and corrected.

FINANCIAL

White stated in her Report that the account balance for the MBS, Michigan United Credit Union and Beverly Hills accounts as of November 30, 2024, would be emailed to all Board members, as well as BACB financial reports as of November 30, 2024. Hard copies of these documents were also distributed to Board Members at the meeting.

CHECK DISBURSEMENT

She pointed out that four (4) checks were written since the date of the last meeting. One check was to the Village of Bingham Farms for the Municipal Support Services Grant for phone and internet in the amount of \$3,044.88. One was to the Michigan Municipal Risk Management Authority for Liability Insurance for \$2,288.50.

ADDITIONAL NOTES

Beginning December 18, 2024 Comcast has increased its prices for certain services and fees. They have notified their customers. Comcast will also be making changes to the format of its bills.

Comcast is spinning off most of its cable channels, including MSNBC and CNBC, into a separately traded company. As of November 20, 2024, the company has not formalized its name and Comcast was calling it "SpinCo".

BAPA/BAMA REPORT

BCTV hosted a Holiday Open House and Orientation with staff, family, friends and residents on December 18, 2024. BCTV is in the brainstorming stages for its first annual sports production camp. He'll have more info at the March meeting. BCTV's 40th Anniversary and Summer Celebration is coming up. More details to come.

Bloomfield Community Television (BCTV) currently broadcasts and records the Beverly Hills Village Council meetings. There have been recent discussions with Council members, Board members, residents, and staff to video record Planning Commission and Zoning Board of Appeals meetings as well. This would allow people to watch the meetings online if they are unable to attend in person.

In 2025, the Planning Commission meets on the fourth Wednesday of the month at 7:00 p.m. In November and December, the Commission meets on the third Wednesday due to the holidays. The Zoning Board of Appeals meets on the second Monday of the month at 7:00 p.m., as needed. The Village of Beverly Hills recognizes that there are other community meetings at this time, so we are looking for our meetings to be recorded, not broadcast live.

I have spoken to BCTV about the additional meeting coverage. BCTV can record the meetings at a cost of \$5,000 per year. There is a line item in the Birmingham Area Cable Board's budget to cover the cost, although a budget amendment would be required. The Village of Beverly Hills is respectfully requesting that the Cable Board cover the cost of recording the two additional meetings per month in an amount not to exceed \$5,000.

Re: 2024 Administrative Grants and Adjusted 2023 Administrative Grants

At the completion of the annual financial statement audit process, it is the policy of the Birmingham Area Cable Board (BACB) to make administrative grants to our four participating communities of a portion of Franchise Fees in excess of board expenditures.

Historically, these administrative grants have been calculated as a percentage of any such excess ranging from 95% to 50% in the prior year.

When determining the percentage of grants for this year, there are a number of considerations to be addressed:

- 1) Consistent with years past, the total amount of franchise fees continue to decline
- 2) Our current contractual obligation with BCTV consumes almost 100% of our PEG fees which places additional pressure on the utilization of Franchise Fees to fund current and future BACB grants and activities
- 3) Another year has passed and there is continued wear and tear on the mobile TV production truck. There will be a need for a replacement vehicle in the next few years and such a purchase will be quite expensive.
- 4) The Fund Balance/Net Position of the BACB continues to decrease (almost \$150,000 in the past year alone.)

In light of these, and many other aspects, it is recommended that our administrative grants for the year ended June 30, 2024 be set at 40% of the excess of Franchise Fees over Board Expenditures or slightly in excess of \$83,000.

Additional Grant related items

Our policy has been to 1) calculate the amount of franchise fees in excess of board expenditures, 2) determine the percentage of any such excess to be returned to our communities as administrative grants 3) estimate the pro-rata allocations for each community.

In prior years, certain communities were delayed in submitting their quarterly Franchise Fee payments to the BACB. As such, it has been our policy to withhold any grant payments from the individual sponsoring community until their funds have actually been received by the BACB and to calculate administrative grants without consideration of these late payments.

In the fiscal year ended June 30, 3023 Bingham Farms had not submitted their Franchise Fee contribution on a timely basis. Accordingly, there was no admin grant given to Bingham Farms in the past fiscal year.

Therefore, in addition to the annual administrative grant for the year ended June 30, 2024, there will be supplemental grants to the four communities to reflect the ultimate collection of prior year Franchise Fees.

There is also a proposed change in how the current and future Administrative Grants are to be calculated.

As noted above, from time to time, certain Franchise Fees are not paid on a timely basis by one or more of our sponsoring communities. However, the Franchise Fees to be paid are noted and reflected in our Full Accrual Basis audited financial statements. In prior years, the administrative grants were calculated using the General Fund – Modified Accrual Basis financial information. In the subsequent year, once the funds have been received, a new calculation is necessary and an adjusted Administrative Grant for the prior year is redetermined and paid out.

It is proposed that

- 1) Administrative Grant calculations are to be made on a Full Accrual Basis and
- 2) Should there be any late payments pending, no grants will be paid to any specific community until their Franchise Fees are actually paid.

This proposal greatly simplifies the annual administrative grant process while still withholding any grant until all of their franchise fee obligations are paid.

In calculating the 2024 Administrative Grants, this new methodology is being implemented. As such, the proposed Administrative Grants are summarized as follows:

Proposal

The BACB Board is requested to adopt the following resolutions

- 1) The calculation of Administrative Grants is to be based on the Full Accrual Basis amounts as contained in the BACB's audited financial information
- 2) No administrative grant is to be paid to a sponsoring community until all of their franchise fee obligations for the fiscal year have been received
- 3) Administrative Grants arising from financial activities of the fiscal year ended June 30, 2024, shall be determined at 40% of the Franchise Fees in excess of Board Expenditures
- 4) The BACB Board is making Administrative Grants to its Sponsoring Communities in the amount of \$83,457 as allocated above.
- 5) A Supplemental Administrative Grant is to be made in the amount of \$8,863 as allocated above.

- C. The Board Chair shall notify the Board regarding the issuance of any additional Board credit cards, or an increase of credit limits on any existing credit cards
- D. Board credit cards may be used only by those board members or employees authorized and only for the purchase of goods or services for official business of the Birmingham Area Cable Board. Board credit cards shall be used in conformance with the Board's purchasing policies.
- E. The board member or employee using any Board credit card must submit documentation (e.g.) receipts detailing the goods or services purchased, cost, date of the purchase, and the specific official Board business for which it was purchased
- F. The Board member or employee issued or using any Board credit card is responsible for its protection and custody and shall immediately notify the Board Chair if the card is lost or stolen
- G. Any Board member or employee issued a Board credit card must immediately surrender the card upon termination of his or her employment or upon request
- H. The treasurer and executive director shall establish a system of internal controls to monitor the use of any Board credit card.
- I. The Board Chair shall approve all credit card purchases and invoices before payment
- J. The balance including interest due on an extension of credit under all credit card arrangements shall be paid not more than 45 days of the initial statement date
