#### APPROVAL OF COSTS TO CONTINUE STREAMING PEG CHANNELS 24/7

Mydloski stated that following the 12/15/21 Cable Board meeting there had been a PEG meeting which was attended by Eick, White, Gugni, Henry, Rota, Black and herself. At the November BACB meeting she reported that Stream Dynamics would no longer be providing 24/7 streaming service. After much research, Rota and Black found that the Tight Rope Media servers that BCTV uses for 24/7 streaming playback service. However, the correct annual cost would be \$1,799.00.

Motion by Mydloski, seconded by Kamoo to approve the cost of Tight Rope from Advanced Lighting and Sound in the amount of \$1,799.00 to continue the 24/7 streaming of PEG Channels.

Rota clarified that the \$1,799.00 was the yearly amount to be paid in December, 2022. He also gave the instructions as to how the public could access the streaming service.

For the future, Rota reminded everyone to be within 6 inches of the microphones when speaking. They are very sensitive and sometimes if you lean back, they might pick up rustling noises coming from around you.

Gugni commented that the 2021 Annual Report was in the January packet for the meeting that never took place. It was a good synopsis of those things the BACB accomplished. White spent a significant amount of time putting it together. She did a wonderful job.

#### **CUSTOMER COMPLAINTS**

We have received three (3) complaints since the date of my last report. Complaint No.2022-02 was filed by a member of the Board of Directors of the Birmingham Woods Condominium Association. He stated that WOW and Comcast have not been following the agreed-upon point of entry into the condo buildings. Wires have been attached improperly on the south and west sides of one of the buildings and he has requested assistance in getting this resolved. This complaint is pending.

Complaint No. 2022-03 was received directly through our website from a Beverly Hills resident. He has some low-hanging wires on his property and although he is a WOW subscriber, he believes that the low-hanging wires belong to either Comcast or AT&T. This complaint has been forwarded to the escalation teams and is currently pending.

Complaint No. 2022-04 was submitted by a Beverly Hills resident who is not a Comcast subscriber but Comcast left a big spool of wire that extends from the pole in her backyard to the ground near her sandbox. This was left after a Comcast crew did extensive work in her adjoining neighbor's backyard. She has requested that this be cleaned up and this complaint is pending.

#### What does ACP cover?
