COMMITTEE REPORTS

Cable Action Committee

Abraham reported there had not been a meeting on September 2 in the Baldwin Public Library as there were no topics which needed to be discussed. The next meeting will be on October 7 at 4:30 PM in the Baldwin Library. He noted that new information has been put on the BACB website. If a board member would like something included on the site, please send him a note and he will forward it to White to have it posted on the site and put out on other media outlets.

PEG Committee

Mydloski reported there had not been a meeting following the August 18 BACB meeting; However, there will be a PEG meeting immediately following this meeting.

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

There were three (3) complaints from last month; all centered around wires. Two (2) of the three (3) have been resolved. One came from a Beverly Hills resident who had contacted the Village Manager about a low-hanging AT&T wire. It was resolved the same day and this complaint is closed. The second (2nd) complaint came from the Code Enforcement Officer for the Village of Franklin concerning branches which were hanging on Comcast's lines along 13 Mile Road. Comcast removed anything that was on its lines. This complaint is closed. The third (3rd) complaint was from a Franklin resident concerning a low hanging AT&T wire on his property. This complaint is pending.

FINANCIAL

Financial information for MBS, Michigan United Credit Union and Beverly Hills accounts and the BACB financial reports for the month of August, 2021 were emailed to the Board Members. Hard copies will also

be distributed at this meeting. The process for this year's audit will begin in the beginning of October.

CHECK DISBURSEMENT

White wrote two (2) small checks since the last meeting.

ADDITIONAL NOTES

Comcast notified White that Great American Country (GAC) will move from Digital Preferred to Digital Starter/Extra. It would be available to more customers and would be at no additional cost.

McLain clarified that any member of the BACB board may attend the meetings with the auditors. White will send a notice to the board members with the time and date of the meeting. Fenberg detailed the audit process and added that the final audit report will be presented at a meeting in December, January or February.

PROVIDER RELATED TOPICS

a. Comcast

There was no representative present and no new information received.

b. AT&T/Uverse/Direct TV

There was no representative present and no new information received.

c. WOW

There was no representative present and no new information received.

McLain received information from Michigan NATOA that its name has changed to Michigan Community Media Association (MICMA) due to the merging and absorption of the Alliance for Community Media in Michigan. With the increase in membership, information and trends can be shared amongst the members. Citizens without local boards like ours may contact the Michigan Public Service Commission directly by going online and submitting an informal complaint. A response time might take 14 days. If the resolution is not satisfactory to the resident, a formal complaint can be submitted.

BAPA/BAMA REPORT

Rota referred to his memo to BACB dated September 9, 2021. He noted there was a list of completed **BAMA** regularly scheduled municipal meetings, all of which were listed in his report.

For the **BAPA** Programs, 15 programs by producers and organizations were taped, which he listed; some were in-person in the studio, some through Zoom and some on location. The sporting events which were approved at the last meeting began with Volleyball and Swim and Dive. Live Groves/Seaholm football will be coming up on September 17 at 7 PM. Soccer is scheduled for Tuesday, September 28.

The Village of Beverly Hills utilizes the internet daily to share information through the Village website, GovDelivery email messages, and social media. The internet is used to post community activities, updates, and important dates. Meeting agendas, minutes, the Village Charter, and the Municipal Code are also posted online. Moreover, we stream Village Council and Cable Board meetings both live and on-demand through our website.

Internet service during the COVID-19 pandemic remains crucial in order to carry out essential services remotely and to keep residents informed in real time. The Village has added options to pay water bills online and pay for other services with a credit card, all of which require internet access to function.

The Village currently contracts with WOW! Business for internet services in the amount of \$186.98 per month. This includes high speed internet, 5 additional static IPs, and a modem. WOW! has satisfactorily provided these services to the Village since 2011. A copy of a recent bill is attached for your reference.

The Village of Beverly Hills respectfully requests a grant in the amount of \$2,243.76 (\$186.98 per month) for the Fiscal Year 2021-2022 (July 1, 2021 to June 30, 2022) to cover internet services for the Village Office.

CUSTOMER COMPLAINTS

We have received eight (8) complaints since the date of my last report. Complaint No. 2021-34 was received from a Birmingham resident who had problems with his DVR and related equipment which was not functioning. Comcast suggested replacing the equipment but this did not resolve the issue. Comcast then scheduled a service call and the technician fixed the problem; however, he received an invoice for \$100 for the service call which he was never told about in advance. He did not believe he should pay for the service call when he was never informed that there would be a charge for coming out and which was due to defective equipment. He made several calls to Comcast about this invoice but Comcast refused to do anything about it. The escalation team applied a credit of \$200 to his account (\$100 for the service call and \$100 for the service issues and customer courtesy). This complaint is closed.

Complaint No. 2021-35 was submitted by a Franklin resident who had a Comcast wire on the ground that needed to be buried. There was also a mess of wires on the pole that needed to be cleaned up and his internet service was very spotty. This subscriber's services are now working and the new drop has been replaced. The Comcast team is scheduled to come back to the property to address removal of the old drop. This complaint is now closed.

Complaint No. 2021-36 was received from a Beverly Hills resident seeking assistance in getting a low-hanging Comcast wire removed or replaced. Comcast removed the old disconnected drop and this complaint is now closed.

Complaint No. 2021-37 was submitted on behalf of a Birmingham resident who had low-hanging Comcast wires on the pole in the rear easement. Comcast has removed the old drop and this complaint is closed.

Complaint No. 2021-38 was received from a Beverly Hills resident trying to get Comcast to bury the pole-to-pole lines running across the middle of his backyard. Comcast is evaluating whether they can honor this resident's request to bury the lines and this complaint is pending.

Complaint No. 2021-39 was submitted by a Beverly Hills resident who requested assistance in getting Comcast to remove a downed wire in his backyard. Comcast has scheduled a crew to go out to confirm that the line belongs to Comcast and to raise it if it is a Comcast drop. This complaint is now closed.

Complaint No. 2021-40 was received from a Birmingham resident who was having difficulty getting Comcast to remove its outside box and wires from her deceased father's home. This complaint has been resolved and is now closed.

Complaint No. 2021-41 was received from one of our Board members who keeps getting a message from Comcast stating "To record, need DVR subscription" every time he tries to schedule a recording. This complaint is pending.

FINANCIAL
